RELIGIOUS ACCOMMODATIONS-HANDICAPPED PERSONS: If special arrangements for testing are required, indicate this on your application form.

RESIDENTS: Candidates must have been legal residents of New York State for at least <u>FOUR</u> months immediately preceding the date of the test. Pursuant to subdivision 4a of Sec. 23 of the Civil Service Law, preference may be given to successful candidates who have been legal residents of the municipality to which the appointment is to be made for at least <u>FOUR</u> months preceding the date of the written test.

AN APPLICATION FEE OF \$10.00 (residents and non-residents) is required for each separately numbered examination for which you apply. The required fee must accompany your online application. If applying and paying in person, we accept Check, money order and debit/credit only. CASH WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. \$20 returned check fee. Please make checks payable to the Saratoga County Treasurer's Office. The \$10 fee is non-refundable. Therefore, you are urged to compare your qualifications carefully with the requirements for admission stated in the "minimum qualifications" section of the examination announcement and file only for those examinations for which you are "clearly qualified". Vague application will not weigh in applicants favor. Applicants will be notified right away if they do not meet minimum qualifications/requirements.

APPLICATION FEE WAIVER: A waiver of application fee will be allowed if you are unemployed and primarily responsible for the support of a household. In addition, a waiver of application fee will be allowed if you are determined eligible for Medicaid, or receiving Supplemental Security Income payments, or Public Assistance (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families/Family Assistance or Safety Net Assistance) or are certified Job Training Partnership Act/Workforce Investment Act eligible through a State or local social service agency, or if you are an honorably discharged Military Veteran (DD214). All claims for application fee waiver are subject to verification. If you can verify eligibility for application fee waiver, "Request for Application Fee Waiver and Certification" form is available as part of the online application process; you may also submit it with your manual application. All applications must be received by the close of business by the deadline as listed on the announcement. <u>DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS</u>: This position is responsible for participating in a wide variety of activities, including but not limited to investigations, personal interviews and reviews of available records and data for prevention and control purposes across the Department's programs. Investigations may involve frequent contact with persons who may have been exposed to infection or are at risk or are suffering from disease or developmental delay. Incumbents must also establish working relationships with providers, community-based organizations, and educational institutions. Incumbents may also be responsible for project management and interpretation and evaluation of data under the general supervision of others. Does related work as required.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: At least...

- (A) Master's degree in public health (or equivalent degree) from an accredited college or university **OR**
- (B) Possession of a Bachelor's degree, plus one (1) year paid full-time or its part-time equivalent** work experience in a local or state health department **OR**
- (C) Possession of an Associate's degree, plus three (3) years paid full-time or its part-time equivalent** work experience in a local or state health department **OR**
- (D) A baccalaureate degree or higher, in nursing from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university, as well as licensure and current registration to practice as a registered professional nurse in New York State. (Degree must have been awarded by a college or university by a regional, national, or specialized agency recognized as an accrediting agency by the US Department of Education/US Secretary of Education. If your degree was awarded by an educational institution outside the United States and its territories, you must provide independent verification of equivalency. A list of acceptable companies who provide this service can be found on the internet at http://www.cs.ny.gov/jobseeker/degrees.cfm. You must pay the required evaluation fee.)

<u>THE WRITTEN TEST</u> will be designed to evaluate knowledge, skills and /or abilities in the following areas: <u>Educating and interacting with the public</u>. These questions test for knowledge of techniques used to interact effectively with individuals and/or community groups, to educate or inform them about topics of concern, to publicize or clarify agency programs or policies, to negotiate conflicts or resolve complaints, and to represent one's agency or program in a manner in keeping with good public relations practices. Questions may also cover interacting with others in cooperative efforts of public outreach or service.

<u>Preparing written material.</u> These questions test for the ability to present information clearly and accurately, and to organize paragraphs logically and comprehensibly. For some questions, you will be given information in two or three sentences followed by four restatements of the information. You must then choose the best version. For other questions, you will be given paragraphs with their sentences out of order. You must then choose, from four suggestions, the best order for the sentences.

<u>Understanding and interpreting written material.</u> These questions test for the ability to understand and interpret written material. You will be presented with brief reading passages and will be asked questions about the passages. You should base your answers to the questions **only** on what is presented in the passages and **not** on what you may happen to know about the topic.

<u>Understanding and interpreting tabular material.</u> These questions test your ability to understand, analyze, and use the internal logic of data presented in tabular form. You may be asked to perform tasks such as completing tables, drawing conclusions from them, analyzing data trends or interrelationships, and revising or combining data sets. The concepts of rate, ratio, and proportion are tested. Mathematical operations are simple, and computational speed is not a major factor in the test. You should bring with you a hand-held battery- or solar-powered calculator for use on this test. You will not be permitted to use the calculator function of your cell phone.

<u>Interviewing.</u> These questions test for knowledge of the principles and practices employed in obtaining information from individuals through structured conversations. These questions require you to apply the principles, practices, and techniques of effective interviewing to hypothetical interviewing situations. Included are questions that present a problem arising from an interviewing situation, and you must choose the most appropriate course of action to take.

<u>Test guide</u>. The New York State Department of Civil Service has NOT prepared a test guide for this examination. However, candidates may find information in the publication 'General Guide to Written Tests' helpful in preparing for this test. <u>NOTICE TO CANDIDATES:</u> "UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTIFIED, CANDIDATES ARE ALLOWED TO USE QUIET, HAND-HELD, SOLAR OR BATTERY POWERED CALCULATORS. Devices with "Typewriter Keyboards," "Spell Checkers," "Personal Digital Assistants," "Address Books," "Language Translators," "Dictionaries," or any similar devices are <u>prohibited</u>.

SECTION 243-b Provides that any member of the armed forces of the United States who had duly filed an application to compete in a scheduled competitive examination, but was deprived of the opportunity to compete in a scheduled competitive examination due to active military duty be provided with a special military makeup examination **SECTION 85a OF THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW:** In conformance with section 85-a of the Civil Service Law, children of firefighters and police officers killed in the line of duty shall be entitled to receive an additional ten points in a competitive examination for original appointment in the same municipality in which his or her parent has served. If you are qualified to participate in this examination and are a child of a firefighter or police officer killed in the line of duty in this municipality, please inform this office of this matter when you submit your application for examination. A candidate claiming such credit has a minimum of two months from the application deadline to provide the necessary documentation to verify additional credit eligibility. However, no credit may be added after the eligible list has been established.

<u>VETERAN CREDITS:</u> For the purpose of claiming veteran credits on a Civil Service examination, an applicant must have served in the armed forces of the United States at any time during the following periods:

World War II – December 7, 1941 to and including December 31, 1946

Korean War – June 27, 1950 to and including January 31, 1955

Vietnam Conflict – February 28, 1961 until May 7, 1975

Lebanon – June 1, 1983 – December 1, 1987

Grenada - October 23, 1983 - November 21, 1983

Panama – December 20, 1989 – January 31, 1990

Persian Gulf – August 2, 1990 to the end of such hostilities (not yet determined)

For hostilities in Lebanon, Grenada, and Panama, the individual <u>must</u> have received the Armed Forces, Navy, or Marine Corps expeditionary medal.

Beginning January 1, 1998, the NYS Constitution allows members of the US Armed Forces who are on active duty (other than for training purposes) the right to request **extra War Time Veterans Credits** on civil service examinations prior to discharge. If you are currently on active duty, you may request the addition of veteran's credits to your examinations score. You must request the extra credits on your examination application in the space provided. If you pass the examination, the credits will be added automatically. To use the extra credits at the time of appointment you must have received an honorable discharge, be a US citizen, and be a resident of New York State. The extra credits can only be used for one NY local Government permanent appointment.

SECTION 23.2: This entire examination is prepared and rated by the New York State Department of Civil Service in accordance with Section 23-2 of the Civil Service Law. The provisions of the New York State Civil Service Rules and Regulations which deal with the rating of examinations will apply.
